Re-named to JAPhMed in 2002



JAPhMed: Committees

1. <u>Education</u> committee

- Monthly educational course
- Examination and Certification in PM
- 2. <u>PMS (post marketing surveillance)</u> committee
 - Network of safety and surveillance information exchange
 - Promoting drug safety science
- 3. <u>Medical Affairs</u> committee
 - Managing non-promotional medical activity
 - Proposing guideline and post-marketing regulation



Practicing PM in Japan

Expected contribution by MDs:

- Accurate identification of unmet medical needs To benefit the patients in need
- Efficient and rationale drug development To improve success rate of trials
- Ethical review and follow up in drug safety To keep the investigation independent of profit
- Effective and quick NDA review/approval To overcome considerable Drug-Lag
- Delivery of unbiased medical education and medical information



JAPhMed Course in Pharmaceutical Medicine

- In compliance with IFAPP's CEPM core curriculum and syllabus
- Class and distance based learning (tbd)
- Currently designed for JAPhMed member physicians
- Provide both education and training

First examination was held in October 2008 15 physicians have been certified as PM Physicians
